#### Senior Exam Notes

Here are some notes concerning the Senior Exams (see schedule on page 1):

- Students only have to be in school for their scheduled exams and mandatory meetings.
- The Administration is allowing the students to be in Pride Day Dress for the exams (see Student Handbook for details). If students cannot cooperate with this dress code, they will be required to be in Regular Dress Code attire.
- Students must turn in their textbooks prior to taking their exam. Failure to do so may result in the students/ parents being charged for their replacement.

#### End of school year can be stressful

Your teen has a test tomorrow. Her history paper is due next week. The math teacher just assigned a group project. And she has a summer job interview this weekend. No wonder she's stressed!

The end of a school year is often a time when students feel overwhelmed by all they have to do. And, since stressed teens are rarely at their best, that can lead them to perform poorly – and below their capabilities.

The good news is that there are ways parents can help teens deal with the stress of this time of the year. You can:

 Listen to her. Sometimes, just giving your teen a chance to let off steam can be a help. Don't try to "fix" her problem. Just let her talk and really listen to her.

- Encourage her to find solutions. Ask
  her questions to help her figure out
  a way to work through the problem.
  Could she create a study schedule? Is it possible to reschedule
  her interview? She's more likely to
  stick with a solution if she's the
  one who developed it.
- Teach her some helpful stress relievers. Taking a few deep breaths before an exam or a job interview can make her feel more in control. A brief walk outside can help her regain her focus. Eating a healthy snack will give her energy

to keep going. But she should avoid high-caffeine energy drinks. They will only make her feel more agitated.

#### Easter Season ends with Pentecost

As May begins and all the events that signal the closing of the school year commence, the Church also marks the completion of the Easter Season and the celebration of Pentecost.

In the readings for the Sixth Sunday of Easter (May 5), Jesus promises the gift of peace and the presence of the Holy Spirit. When we accept the Holy Spirit as present in our life we will not be taught what to believe but to believe.

The Seventh and last Sunday of Easter has Jesus praying to His Father for His disciples and for us that we may be united in love and demonstrate that love by the way we live and our concern for each other.

The Feast of Pentecost will be celebrated on May 19, and it marks the end of the Easter season (the Baccalaureate Mass will be held this day). The Church honors Mary this month as the Mother of Jesus. Let us pray for all who have been blessed with the charism of motherhood – mothers, grandmothers, stepmothers, godmothers, adoptive mothers, and birthmothers – and thank God for their love, care and concern.

## Baseball team starts 11-1, undefeated in league play

The St. Mary's Varsity Baseball Team has started the 2013 season very strong, presently being undefeated (5-0) in league play with an 11-1 record overall.

After starting the season with nonleague wins against Newfane and their four opponents during the Myrtle Beach trip during Easter Break, the Lancers recorded their only loss, falling to Lancaster, 3-1.

Once they started league play, they have been unstoppable with wins over Timon (17-1 and 4-3), St. Francis (8-5), Canisius (7-2), Nichols (8-6), and St. Joe's (1-0).

Senior Chris Kwitzer is leading the Lancers in nearly all offensive categories, including hits, runs-batted-in, batting average, slugging percentage, and onbase percentage.

On the mound, senior Lucas Schaefer

has a 6 and 1 record, with 28 strike outs while having a 1.28 earned run average. Senior Brian Dudek is two-for-two in save opportunities, while anchoring the Lancer defense at shortstop.

The Lancers' season will continue with a rematch against St. Joe's, make-up games versus St. Francis, Canisius, and Nichols, and a home-and-home against Cardinal O'Hara.
